Background

- Network of European election observers
- Memorandum of Understanding with EP "This Time I'm Voting"
- Needs Assessment & Election Assessment Mission 2020
 - 28 National Chapter Focal Points
 - 65 Election observers and experts
 - 8 like-minded organisations accross Europe
 - 1 Coordination Team in Brussels



Some Facts

- May 2019: 426 mio citizens eligible to elect 751 MEPs
- Transnational campaigns yet rare, but campaigns decidedly more European
- BREXIT impact on the electoral process
- Increased turnout: 50.62%
- Overall legal framework no central EMB
- Essentially, 28 different EMBs regulate the elections to one representative body





ELECTORAL THRESHOLD, SEAT ALLOCATION AND LISTS/PREFERENTIAL VOTES





Harmonise voting methods

- 10 EU MS have advance voting
- 15 EU MS offer postal voting
- 6 EU MS No out of country voting
- 4 EU MS allow proxy voting
- Internet voting in Estonia
- 4 EU MS with compulsory voting
- No equal access to the vote

Participation of Persons with Disabilities

- EU acceeded to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD)
- MS prioritise physical accessibility & participation through alternative voting techniques
- 14 MS guarantee the right to vote for all PWD without restrictions
- 14 MS with limited suffrage rights (based on mental disability or lack of legal capacity)
- Need to adhere to int. Standards in the EU

Level campaign playing field

- New regulatory framework (APPF) at EU level, but different national frameworks
- Unequal conditions for parties and candidates in the MS
- European political parties can receive funding from the EU
- Foreign funding is forbidden in half of MS (in 10 also funding by European parties)
- Public funding available in all but 3 MS
- Lack of reporting requirements for campaign expenditure in some MS



Regulations for Election Observation

- Regulations vary across EU Member States
- > 8 EU MS have full legislation and accreditation
- > 5 EU MS voting and counting open to the public
- Election-Watch.EU was accredited by 12 EU MS
- Need to fully acknowledge role of observers





Electoral Reform Advocacy

- 16 Recommendations
- Findings presented to EC and EP
- Together with 42 other organisations advocay for the European Democracy Action Plan
- Greater efforts to protect European election integrity needed
- Window of legislative opportunity until 2023
- New legislation regulating party finance & social media a priority in the EU
